

**Office of State Personnel
Workers' Compensation Supplemental Leave Schedule
January 1, 2007**

Effective October 1, 1987, the State Personnel Commission policy allowed an employee to supplement the weekly benefit by use of earned sick or vacation leave. Employees on workers' compensation leave drawing temporary total disability benefits may supplement the weekly benefit by the use of earned sick or vacation leave in accordance with a schedule published by the Office of State Personnel each year. Since the employee must receive the weekly benefit, this will provide an income approximately equal to their take home (after taxes) pay prior to their injury.

The maximum weekly benefit effective January 1, 2007, is \$754. This new maximum has no application to any injuries that occurred before January 1, 2007.

Listed below is the new Workers' Compensation Supplemental Leave Schedule for 2007:

Note: For partial weeks of temporary total disability, the daily rate for supplemental hours is determined by dividing the hours allowed per week by five.
